Battle of Passchendaele Requiem

Monday 31 July marks the centenary of the start of the Battle of Passchendaele, one of the most infamous battles of the First World War. Over ½ million soldiers died between July and November 1917. The 12.30pm Mass will be a Requiem for the repose of their souls.

Scaffolding

You will have noticed that there is scaffolding in the north aisle. This is to allow some exploratory work to be carried out on the aisle ceilings where plaster is crumbling and repairs may be needed to the supporting metal work. This should take no more than six weeks. Depending on what is discovered further work is likely later in the year or the beginning of next year on both the north and south Aisles. We will keep you informed.
